Proper tennis shoes must be worn.



Daylesford must see and do...

Daylesford is a beautiful and charming country town in the Mineral Springs area of Victoria, about a 90-minute drive north west of Melbourne. Here are a few must see and do places, with just a slight bias toward food, wine and art....

Passing Clouds Winery and Vineyard, Musk

Musk is a 10-minute drive from Daylesford, in the Macedon Ranges region, which is arguably Australia's coldest grape growing region. Passing Clouds was established by Graeme Leith after much research in 1998, and has the reputation for the coldest vineyard in the Macedon Ranges region. How is that for cool climate! Passing Clouds now have several vineyards in the Bendigo and Macedon region, making all their wines at this winery. Graeme's son Cameron is now the winemaker, however Graeme continues to keep an eye on things – and also appears on the label for their fabulously tasty Shiraz Cabernet. Their cellar door is open 7 days a week for tastings of their Fools on the Hill Pinot Noir and Chardonnay as well as Graeme's Shiraz Cabernet. Better still, make a reservation for their lunch "a la famiglia", a very family friendly spit roast affair every Friday to Monday. Gorgeous!

Farmers Arms Hotel, Daylesford

As you pass out of Daylesford toward Passing Clouds Vineyard, you will pass by the oldest pub in Daylesford, the iconic Farmers Arms Hotel. Built in 1857 and now owned by Mitch Duncan and his partner Steven Chau, the Farmers Arms retains much of its country charm and marries this with a sophisticated dining menu, an extensive wine list and professional and friendly service. This is the place where locals and visitors mingle for lunch and dinner seven days per week. Executive chef Gavan Anders' menu is so interesting and tasty – something for everyone. Look out for their Tribute to ABBA evening during Chillout – I dare you not to sing along. I can think of one Victennis member who you will no doubt meet there that evening!

The Convent Gallery, Daylesford

Nestled on the crest of Wombat Hill Botanical Gardens, the Convent Gallery boasts panoramic views over the town of Daylesford and surrounding countryside. Built as a private residence in the 1860's and converted to a convent and Catholic boarding school in the 1880's, it was closed in 1973 then later converted into the Convent Gallery – now a must-experience in Daylesford. There is an extensive modern art gallery and exhibition as well as historical remnants of the old convent. The chapel remains and is now fully restored. With the extensive gardens on site this would be a truly memorable location for that up-coming wedding – just saying. During the day Bad Habits café serves great food and in the Altar Bar has that special cocktail as well as an extensive wine list in order to keep your energy levels up. The Convent – as they say, built on a hill to be closer to heaven. Well, you wont find Margaret Court here, but you may soon find her nemesis available to perform appropriate ceremonies if you ask nicely!
